



Killam Fellowships for Canadian Students

The Killam Fellowships Program provides an opportunity for exceptional undergraduate students from universities in Canada to spend either one semester or a full academic year as an exchange student in the United States. Students may participate in the program either as a direct exchange student (registering at their home university, paying their home fees, and attending the host university as an exchange visitor) or as a self-placed visiting student (registering at the host university and paying host tuition fees). Canadian applicants interested in the direct exchange program must be registered at one of our partner Canadian universities and be planning to visit one of our partner American universities.

Killam Fellowships for Canadian Students

The Killam Fellowships Program provides a cash award of \$5,000 US per semester (\$10,000 for the full academic year), an all-expense paid three day orientation in Ottawa, and a three day all-expense paid seminar in Washington. In addition, the Foundation provides all Killam Fellows with a health insurance allowance of \$500 US. All Killam Fellows are also eligible to apply for a mobility (in-country travel) grant in an amount not to exceed \$800 US. The mobility initiative allows students to undertake an educational field trip, providing an opportunity to gain a more comprehensive understanding of the culture of the United States.

General Eligibility Requirements

- Canadian Citizenship (permanent residents and/or landed immigrants are not eligible).
- Enrollment as full-time time undergraduate student in good standing at a degree-granting institution in Canada
- Superior and competitive academic record
- Proficiency in English
- Limited U.S. experience

Selection is open and competitive, based on a combination of the proposed program of research, academic and professional background, personal statement, letters of reference, and adherence to the aims of the Canada-U.S. Fulbright Program. Fulbright Canada is committed to recognizing the inherent dignity and worth of every person, and to the provision of equal rights and opportunities without discrimination of any kind. All applicants will be considered without regard to race, religion, ancestry, color, ethnic origin, creed, gender, age, sexual orientation, marital status, family status, or handicap. Fulbright Canada encourages applications from all interested and eligible candidates.
